Syllabus for ECON 416/516 Empirical Industrial Organization Fall 2016

Course Description: Industrial organization is the study of industry and firm behavior. Using the basic tools of microeconomic theory and game theory, this course explores the relationships among firms in an industry or across industries by examining the nature of strategic interaction among firms. We will study theoretical models and empirical evidence for a wide variety of market phenomena.

Prerequisites: Econometrics I

Attendance: Attendance of lectures is both expected and required. There will be material covered in class that you will be responsible for knowing that may not be covered in the text. Thus, it is important that you be in class, on time, everyday.

Course Withdrawal: The last day to withdraw from the class and receive an automatic "W" is Wednesday, October 19, 2016. This is also the last day to get a withdrawal slip signed without a special petition. After this date, you can obtain a late withdrawal from a course only by first receiving special permission from the dean of SHSS. Such permission is very difficult to get. University rules specify that permission for late withdrawals is "given only for urgent reasons relating to extended illness or equivalent distress" to a student who is "passing the course on the date of withdrawal."

Valid Excuses: During the course many possible events may occur that would result in your inability to attend class, exams, or perform at a minimally acceptable level during an examination. The followings can be legitimate reasons to miss class or to be excused from a scheduled examination.

- Illness or injury: a note from a physician, physician's assistant, or a nurse-practitioner that says, among other things, "..unable to attend." is required. The words "unable to attend" must be precisely stated in the note. If the note leaves any ambiguity on this point you will not be excused. Further, a copy of the note must be provided to the instructor within one week of the missed course event (in cases of extended illness or incapacity, the note must be provided within a week of the end of your illness or incapacity, and it should specify the period of your inability to attend the course).
- Family emergencies: you must provide verifiable documentation of the emergency. Given the vast array of family emergencies the instructor will provide precise guidance as to what constitutes adequate documentation. Unless the emergency is critical you should notify the instructor in advance of your absence from the scheduled course event. In cases of critical emergencies, you must notify the instructor within one week of your absence.
- University-approved curricular and extra-curricular activities: verifiable documentation is also required. The student should obtain from the unit or department sponsoring the activity a letter (or class absence form) indicating the anticipated absence(s). The letter must be presented to the instructor at least one week prior to the first absence.
- Religious holidays: the student should notify the instructor by the third week of the course of any potential conflicts.

Unless otherwise specified in this syllabus, all rules and regulations contained in NU policies and procedures will be followed.
